From the Pastor's Desk

Recently, a Trinity member gave me an op-ed piece to read; it was written by Cal Thomas about the recently released movie, "Noah." The controversy surrounding "Noah," concerns how closely the movie follows the Biblical story. Seems that the creators of the movie took some liberties with the story and some Christians were upset that people who saw the movie and weren't familiar with the Bible might be misled about what the true intent of the story of Noah is. Interestingly, Thomas states that, despite the controversy, Christians should be glad that Hollywood considers Biblical stories worthy of the big screen.

Now, I don't get that upset about moviemakers "stretching" stories - Biblical or otherwise - in order to make movies. I understand that making movies is about making money, more so than it is about truth-telling or even entertainment. Controversy surrounding certain movies is usually encouraged in order to get more people in the theater. And, needless to say, controversy about movies based on the Bible is certainly not uncommon.

For example, there was the controversy 25 years ago about the movie, "The Last Temptation of Christ," particularly the Catholic Church's view that the movie was full of misinformation and heresy. One of the last scenes in "The Last Temptation..." had the devil tempting Christ by showing Jesus what His life would be like if He'd just ask God to spare Him. While most of us know that this "last temptation" portrayed in the movie did not happen in the Bible, it's interesting that in the movie when the devil comes to tempt Christ, he comes disguised as an angelic waif-like girl. Someone was very wise to realize that, when wanting to tempt someone, the devil would thus disguise himself.

Ten years ago, the Mel Gibson movie, "The Passion of Jesus Christ," created similar controversy, especially to those who thought that the portrayal of Jesus' crucifixion was a little too realistic, a little too violent. In addition, people felt that the movie took too many liberties in portraying Jesus' relationships with the people surrounding him. Yet, despite all the controversy, some Christians said "The Passion..." made them realize, for the first time, just what Christ suffered on the cross when he was crucified.

Ultimately, watching movies about Biblical stories, makes us realize that the Bible has always been a book of controversy. Even without someone else stretching, redefining, or recreating its stories, God's Word has always stirred up thought-provoking conversation, as did Jesus Christ Himself. And, maybe, that's the way God wants it!

It does us good to read - or re-read - Bible stories like Noah and to ask God to give us the understanding to discern their meanings. It is good to discuss the Bible, and to recognize that all stories in it are to be viewed through the lens of Jesus Christ because those stories ultimately point to Him. Most of all, through our discussions, we come to realize that the Bible is altogether a story about salvation, **our salvation**, the salvation given to all of us through God's Word, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

APRIL 13th COUNCIL MINUTES

Our Mission: "To become more like Jesus, reaching out to our community with God's love."

One the day of council meeting the checking account was positive \$300. The brass plates were cleaned, polished, and replaced on the doors. cost over \$1,000 to fix the commode in the basement. This is a reminder only toilet paper in the commodes!! Property committee is still looking at different options for heating the sanctuary. A heat pump would cost \$18,000 and this would supplement the current system. Wrapping or blown in insulation could be done but the wiring must be checked first in the sanctuary. The wiring is old and brittle and is not safe. Congregation approve addition to the TLC fund bylaws on April 13, 2014 before church services. A medical emergency form for children attending Sunday school and Bible school was created. It has essential health and parent contact information on it. This form will be kept in a red notebook in the church office for quick and easy access. Fundraising committee sold 86 pies/rolls/breads. Total profit was \$185 because someone donate the money for the cost of shipping. They have over \$1,000 in their checking account. This committee benefits the Property committee. Trinity & Messiah share the same Bible School material. Trinity received a Certificate of Appreciation from Camp Mt. Luther for the Love Offering. A reminder to children of Trinity that wants to go to camp, we pass half the fee for the child. The Palm Walk in Beaver Springs, on Palm Sunday had 35 to 40 walkers. Daniel Spigelmyer has tone deafness and needed hearing aids. Council approve to give him his complete grant of \$1,000 to him to help with schooling and hearing aids. Trinity has a grant of Steward of Life for seminarian students.

CHANGE TO TLC MINISTRY FUND BY-LAWS

Before worship on Sunday, April 13, a brief Congregational meeting was held in order to make a change to the TLC Ministry Fund By-Laws. The proposed change was an addition to By-Law D.1.c.1 which has to do with the disbursement of money from the TLC Ministry Fund. This specific By-Law states that money from the TLC Ministry Fund can be disbursed to programs within the congregation and reads as follows:

Congregational level programs: Programs and activities that are conducted by someone within the congregation, having effects on the members of the congregation. Distributions from the Fund shall not be used for the congregation's own normal operating expenses, such as salaries, maintenance, supplies, or utilities, unless required by a specific bequest.

The congregation voted on adding the following sentence to this By-Law (D.1.c.1):

Exceptions may be permitted for limited specific improvements to be approved by both Council and Congregation, not to exceed the undesignated principal amount of \$75,000 and all TLC contributions from December to the present.

The addition of the above sentence to By-Law D.1c.1 was done to permit Trinity's Council and Congregation to access money from TLC Ministry Fund in the case of a major expense; for example, replacement of the church's boiler. Anyone who would like a complete copy of the TLC Ministry Fund By-Laws, please see Pr. Lisa. If you have any questions about this addition and/or the TLC Ministry Fund, don't hesitate to attend any monthly Council meeting.
